





- The Assembly of European Regions producing Fruits, Vegetables and Ornamental Plants is an association that represents the voice of the fruit, vegetable and horticultural regions and their producer organisations in Europe.
- The specificity and strength of AREFLH lies in its original structure: it is composed of the College of Regions and the College of Producers. The complementarity of these two bodies allows the adoption of common positions between regions and representatives of producer organisations.
- AREFLH gathers 20 EU regions and 23 POs/APOs from 7 European countries (FR,IT,ES,PT,GR).
- Together they represent ca. 40% of the total production of F&V in Europe.

The fruit and vegetable sector in the EU: a statistical overview

- The fruit and vegetable sector in Europe accounts for 21 % of the total value of agricultural production
- It takes up only 3 % of arable land and is worth more than EUR 50 billion
- Represents ca. 30% of agricultural employment while receiving only around 3.5% of the CAP expenditure.
- F&V supply chain has an estimated turnover of more than EUR 120 billion, with approximately 550 000 employees and acts as an economic multiplier at European level, stimulating both demand and the creation of added value

in other economic sectors

EUFRUIT Project



What is it: EUFRUIT is a EU project (thematic network) financed in the framework of the Horizon2020 research and innovation programme, and started in March 2016 with a duration of 3 years.

Objective: Creating a multi-actor network to unleash, stimulate and use European research potential for exploiting new opportunities in the fresh produce category.

Project Coordinator: Dr. Michelle Williams, Department of Food Sciences, Aarhus University

Budget: 1,8 million euro



































Project Description



- The project's consortium is composed by 21 partners out of 12 European countries
- The project aims to **coordinate** and **support** innovation in the fruit sector and ensure integration across the research-to-market chain of the fruit sector
- 4 thematic areas:
 - **New cultivar** development and evaluation
 - Reducing use of chemicals during production phase to minimise residues on fruit and in the environment
 - Optimising postharvest handling, storage and quality attributes of fruit
 - Sustainable production systems and approaches across a range of key European fruit species

The EU fruit project intends to establish a network of relevant stakeholders to address key challenges for the fruit sector



































EUFRUIT will establish a systematic and standardised approach for knowledge-gathering and dissemination along three axes:

- Scanning & synthesis of knowledge
- Showing & sharing
- Sustaining project results
- Scanning & synthesis: establishment of international expert groups who scan state-of-the-art knowledge, existing practices and novel technologies, and synthesis to identify key areas of learning, new knowledge and best practices
- **Showing & sharing**: establishment of network groups to ensure mutual learning between stakeholders at national and regional level
- **Sustaining**: delivering activities aimed at ensuring the long-term viability of the EUFRUIT project results and network beyond the life of the project through continual dialogue with existing national and EU-level efforts.



Project objectives





























- Establish a European network focused on the fruit sector, including both industrial and academic partners to secure an optimal flow of knowledge and practical knowhow
- **Develop and implement a systematic approach for scanning and synthesising** existing scientific and practical knowledge
- Establish an ongoing dialogue with relevant EU, national and regional policy bodies
- To identify and support new priority areas of research
- **Deploy an intense dissemination strategy** centered on EUFRUIT
